In 2003,

California's preschool system was not fully equipped to provide high-quality programs to the children who need it most.



Only 50% of low-income families

enrolled their children in preschool.

Of 3 million children aged 0-5, one out of four lived in poverty.

Exemplars of high-quality preschool and Transitional Kindergarten programs are being developed.




A field to support preschool is taking shape.

While preschool access has advanced, quality has lagged.

In 2013, California met just four out of ten standards for quality preschool education, falling behind 36 other states nationwide⁵.

We must ensure that those with access to preschool have the experiences they need to succeed in school and beyond.











And while more four-year-olds are entering preschool, access for three-year-olds remains low.


